Finally, a massive thank you to our volunteers who turn up at the site 7am and build the gazebos, lay out the mats and lug the barriers around - it is very much appreciated.

RECREATION AREA AND PARK

It is great to see that the recreation area is getting used, if you could try to avoid breaking anything while you're there it would be appreciated! We are onto our 4th padlock now as every time someone bounces the barrier arm up to try to force their car under it (yes, people do this) it pulls the padlock out of shape. There is a barrier for a reason, the concrete apron is big enough to fit a few cars on - please simply use that!

The PC is in the process of reviewing the equipment provision in the Garth Drive Park. The main play frames are coming to the end of their usable lifespan and it would be nice to have some up to date and more inclusive options available. Once an initial idea is created, the PC will consult the residents and would love to hear the thoughts of the people who use the park - the kids themselves! If your child(ren) would like to be involved in the consultation process, please let the clerk know and you will be contacted with an update as soon as there is one.

SPEEDING ON FIELD LANE AND IN THE VILLAGE

The PC has been made aware of people speeding along Field Lane, past the Thorpe Willoughby Sports Club. This is in Hambleton Parish, and we're asking residents using this route to BE AWARE OF YOUR SPEED - it is a **30mph** road for a reason. However, PLEASE REDUCE YOUR SPEED on ALL the residential roads, **20mph really is plenty** on these roads and even 10mph is enough on roads such as Back Lane!



We have a wonderful sense of community in our village; people want to get involved and help other people who need support. We have been asked by Wendy Bainbridge to let people know that she collects your unwanted clothes for The Clothing Bank. As an official drop-off for the charity, you can leave your bags of unwanted clothes at her home and she will deliver them to the charity to be sorted and distributed to those in need. Sarah Hanson is also a drop-off point, based at PlaySafe at the primary school - convenient if you're on the school run!

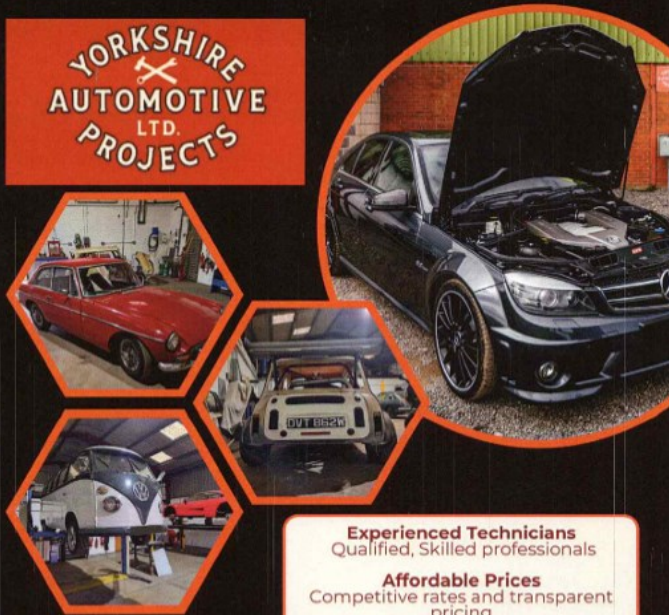

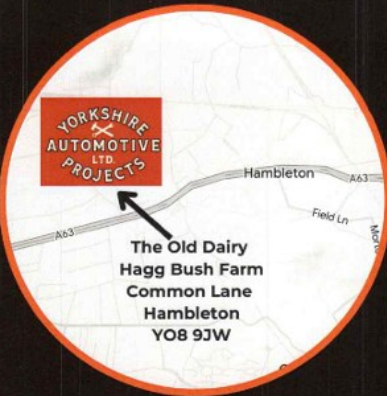
